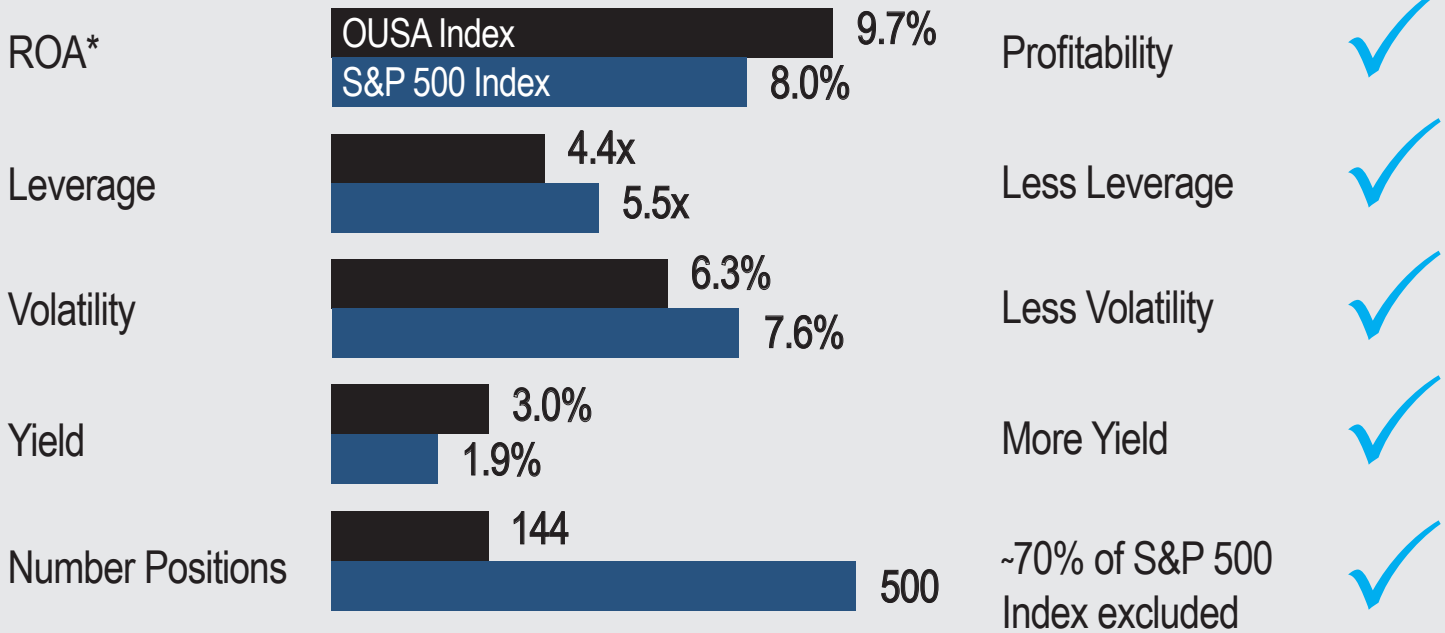


Why own the ETF "OUSA" instead of the S&P 500?

Since inception of OUSA (7/14/2015), the S&P 500 has generated five negative months. The value loss of a \$10,000 investment during those months for OUSA was \$1,025, versus \$1,678 for the S&P 500, with OUSA protecting \$653 on the downside on a monthly return basis.
