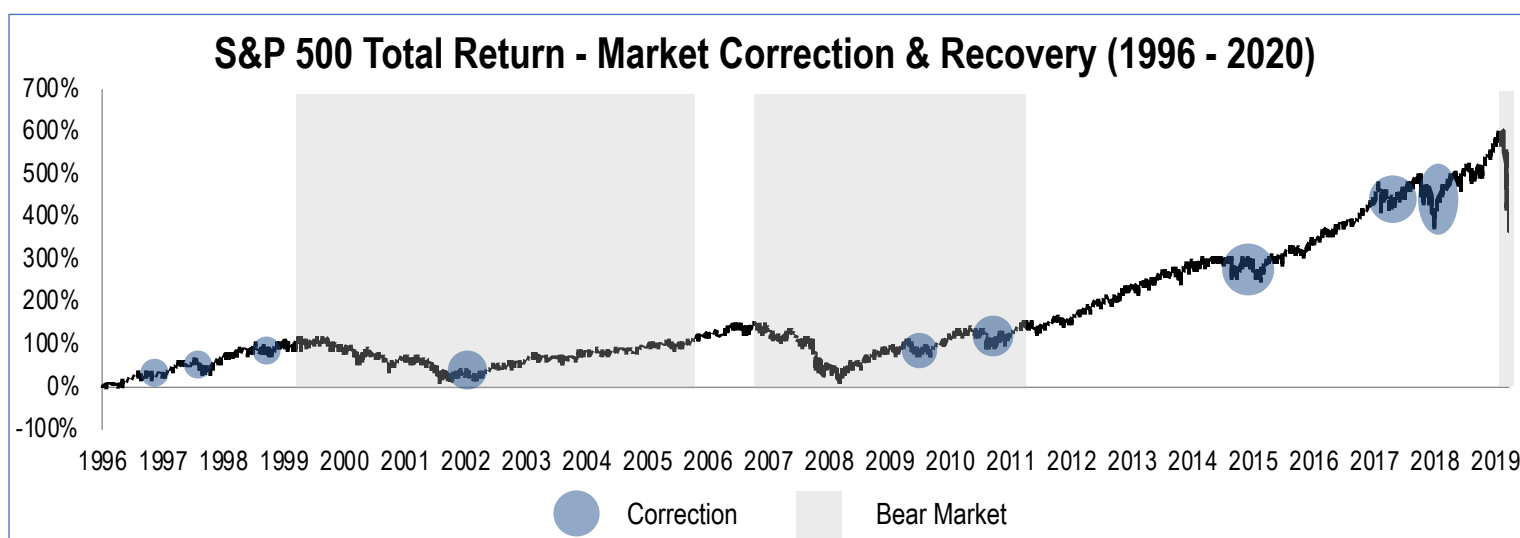


Corrections and Bear Markets Can Be Good Opportunities for Long-Term Investors

Since 1996, the S&P 500 has fallen into correction 10 times and a bear market 3 times, including this year. Corrections are broadly defined as a 10% decline from a recent 52-week high, whereas a bear market is a 20% decline from recent market highs. The average decline for these 13 events, dating back to 1996 is 21%.

The average time from peak to trough is 6 months. On average, it has taken 10 months to recover from previous 10 corrections and 2 bear markets. This illustrates that long-term investors may benefit from holding onto their investments during periods of market stress.

Historically, the S&P 500 has rebounded strongly after these market stress events. The 1, 3 and 5-year total returns after these events are 32%, 58% and 83%, on average. This suggests the recent sell-off may provide a good buying opportunity for long-term investors.
